

Subject expectations:

Physics is a hard but very rewarding subject that requires lot of independent work. We will ask you to follow these rules to get the best out of each lesson:

- Attendance: There is a lot of contents to cover in Physics lessons. If you miss several lessons, your learning will be affected. Make sure you come to every lesson and you tell your teachers if, for a good reason, you are unable to attend. We will be willing to guide you through the contents of that lesson and suggest work you can do to not be left behind! But make sure your attendance aims for 100%!
- **Punctuality:** You need to know your timetable and your ways around the school to ensure you are not late to lessons. There is a lot to go through every day, so we cannot miss a second!
- **Equipment:** You are not going to need all the required equipment for every lesson, but if you don't bring everything to every lesson, chances are you may end up being unable to follow it. The basic equipment required for physics is:

A folder to write your own notes/do the exercises.

A pen, a pencil and a rubber.

A ruler and a protractor.

A calculator.

- **Ready to learn:** Expectations are that you are quiet and work hard every single lesson. Teachers, technicians and any other member of staff know what they are doing. Let's listen to each other and follow the rules! This is especially important when doing practical.
 - Also, to get the best out of each lesson, it is a good idea to read through the unit in advance. We will be asking you to make your own notes in-lesson as well as independently. If you come ready with a lot of questions, we will be eager to answer them and the learning of the whole classroom will improve.
- Homework and independent work: Your teachers will set homework on a regular basis and will also ask you to complete independent work/research, (even though there is no course work in Physics). You need to make sure you complete every task asked in order to boost your learning and physics comprehension. It will pay off on the Results Day!
