The languages department at Little Heath offers pupils the opportunity to learn French at Key Stage 3 and French, German and Spanish at Key Stages 4 and 5. Study of languages encompasses far more than learning pieces of vocabulary in different languages. Rather it equips the learner with a range of skills and strategies enabling them to manage new situations and unfamiliar environments as well as deepening their knowledge of their own language and gives them a different perspective on their own culture. Learning a language opens new windows on the world, a world where even distant countries are easily accessible online. Our mission is to prepare our students for a rapidly changing world by giving them a global perspective.

We see the principle benefits of learning a language as falling into three categories:

Personal

- Develop understanding of and empathy with others
- Develop confidence in speaking in new contexts
- Promote listening and interpersonal skills
- Encourage a resilient mind-set to making mistakes and learning from them

Cultural

- Deepen student awareness, appreciation and understanding of the wider world
- Encourage students to view British culture and values as part of a wider global community

Linguistic

- Develop knowledge of linguistic structures to promote more reflective language use in both the target language and English
- Promote ability to use strategies to enable communication and comprehension (e.g. paraphrasing, simplifying)
- Enable clarity in personal expression and promote problem-solving attitude to communication



KS3 Language Curriculum Overview (Year 7 & 8)

At KS3 we follow the National Curriculum. All students study French in Years 7 and 8 through discrete lessons delivered by a specialist team of teachers. We aim to encourage a curious attitude to other cultures and enjoyment in learning foreign languages. There are end of topic tests at the end of each term that focus on one or two of the four skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing.

KS4 French, German and Spanish Curriculum Overview (Year 9, 10 & 11)

At KS4 French, German and Spanish we follow the AQA GCSE with final exams in Year 11. Lessons are delivered by a specialist team of teachers. KS5 French, German and Spanish Curriculum Overview (Year 12 & 13)

YEAR 11

At KS5 we follow the AQA A Level qualification. Exams are taken at the end of Year 13. Lessons are delivered by a specialist team of teachers. From the start, we build on knowledge acquired from KS4. The course covers a range of topics relating to the society and culture of the language studied and current affairs. We therefore aim to deepen learners' knowledge of the countries and cultures of the languages being studied and encourage their engagement with issues at the heart of today's society. Students are required to complete an independent research project and read around the subject in their own time. There are end of topic tests at the end of each term that focus on several exam skills: listening, reading, speaking and writing. Students study a film in Year 12 and study novel in Year 13.
