



The Sixth Form Team includes highly experienced staff with a proven track record of offering first class pastoral care, academic guidance and support.

The team is made up of a Head of Sixth Form; a Key Stage 5 Progress Leader; a Key Stage 5 Study Manager; Key Stage 5 Administrator and Key Stage 5 Student Services Support, all of whom are dedicated to working with our students to ensure that they get the most out of their Sixth Form experience at Little Heath School.

This team is also supported by an experienced and committed tutor team, where tutors will play a leading role in supporting Sixth Form students throughout the two years of their stay with us.

As well as a carefully planned tutor programme, all students have regular individual and small group meetings with their tutor. These meetings will help the tutor to write academic and work place references for their tutees, supporting their individual application process.

The tutors also play a key role in the monitoring of students' progress and will help them devise effective strategies for reaching their academic and wider school targets.

Pupils enjoy their time and their learning at this school. They feel safe, cared for and welcome.

NEXT STEPS

We recognise that the world of work and university study has become more competitive over the last few years, and thus we work hard to support students in planning for their future.

As well as support from the dedicated Sixth Form team, the Careers Leader is always available and based in the Sixth Form library at least one day a week. In addition, a professional Careers Advisor is also available for a confidential one to one meeting on request and we have an ex-alumni network of support and an extremely wide variety of business volunteers. Together, this team works very hard to support our Year 12 students in helping them to arrange meaningful work experience.

Students who are considering applying to go to university or college are given advice in choosing the right course. We have very close links with a range of universities, including admissions tutors. We liaise closely with admission tutors at Oxford and Cambridge University in an attempt to maximise the chances of our students being successful in their applications.

All students are registered with Unifrog, a very important careers tool which contains comprehensive information on Oxbridge, all university courses and apprenticeship vacancies throughout Europe.

Students seeking employment or an apprenticeship at the end of Year 13 are given help via visiting industry experts providing talks and advice, their tutors with the completion of application forms and the writing, when necessary, Curriculum Vitae documents. of Students are also informed, on a regular basis, of local vacancies and training opportunities through our Careers Service at Little Heath School, with all students being able to access our careers library.



ENRICHMENT

Extra-Curricular Opportunities

We offer an extensive range of extracurricular activities to our students. These are designed to broaden and enrich the experience we offer to our students, helping them to be ready for life after their Sixth Form studies.

Student Leadership

We appoint prefects in Year 12 who are given lots of opportunity to support the school by working with departments and Heads of Year. In Year 13, students can apply to join the Senior Student Leadership Team. This is comprised of two Head Students, four Deputy Head Students and four House Captains (one for each House). This high-profile group not only leads the prefect team and represents the Sixth Form at major events, but plays a key role in making important decisions about developments in the Sixth Form, as well as across the rest of the school.

HOW DO I APPLY AND WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Once you have chosen your courses and checked your grades against the entry requirements (these can be found in the <u>Course Information Booklet</u>), you should complete the online application form which can be found on the Sixth Form area of the school website.

Most students apply to do three subjects, although we are able to offer students the opportunity to study four subjects if it fits in with their plans for future courses and careers.

Starting in January, members of the Sixth Form Team will meet with all potential Sixth Form students to discuss their course choices to ensure they match their academic strengths and future career plans.

WHAT SUBJECTS SHOULD I CHOOSE?

Choosing the right Sixth Form course is a difficult decision. As well as doing lots of thinking about your strengths and weaknesses and what interests you, you will need to read the course booklet carefully and talk to your subject teachers, form tutor and parents. We also hold a Sixth Form Surgery for students and parents across one week during the application process. This is an ideal opportunity to talk through any concerns you might have about your choices.

If you are not sure about what you want to do when you leave the Sixth Form, choose a course you enjoy and where you are most likely to succeed. A Levels and Vocational subjects are demanding courses and you won't want to do the hard work necessary for success if you're not interested and motivated in the subjects you are studying.



CAN I STUDY A COMBINATION OF A LEVEL AND VOCATIONAL SUBJECTS?

Yes – every year we have a considerable number of students who study a mixture of the more traditional A Level courses with the more vocational courses. We will offer you guidance and support to ensure that you are taking courses that are tailored to your strengths and aspirations.



WILL I NEED TO BUY MY OWN TEXTBOOKS?

Yes – departments will let you know what books you need once you have started in year 12. It might be possible to buy some second-hand books from students who have just completed their examinations.



WHAT SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE IF MY FAMILY FACES FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES?

We will encourage all eligible students to apply for the 16-19 Bursary. This is a scheme which enables schools to give financial support to students who might struggle to buy the necessary equipment such as textbooks for their KS5 studies. Students will be able to apply for this support in September of Year 12.
