

PRIVATE PILOT'S LICENCE TRAINING COURSE

The aim of the Scholarship Programme is to assist the successful individual, who might otherwise not have the necessary resources, to achieve their Licence. The Scholarship covers only direct training and examination costs. The costs of obtaining the Class 2 Medical Certificate and any associated travel, subsistence and accommodation expenses are the responsibility of the Scholarship winner.

The criteria for successful applications includes:

- your availability to undertake and complete the Scholarship during the summer 2023
- you must be able to satisfy the relevant medical standard to enable issue of a Class 2 Medical Certificate issued in the UK in accordance with Part Med
- you must be aged at least 17 on *1 June 2023*

The Company will expect training to be carried out at a Flying School in the UK approved by the Company; to be commenced during the summer 2023 and to be completed by 28 September 2023.
